Cambodia: Partnering With Church Planters

This report is by Pastor Nhean Thonsovan from the Mission Headquarters church in Phnom Penh, Cambodia.

All of the radios we received have been shared with the church planters who are working outside of Phnom Penh. Sixty percent of our church planters are equipped with the radios, and they are working in 19 provinces. The radios are used in small group evangelism, where five or six people gather to listen to the programs. The radio is good quality and easy to use, because when the battery power is low, we can turn a wheel to recharge it.

After listening to one of the programs, the chief of the commune at Shihaknuk Ville city asked for some materials of the “good news” by mail. I sent them through the church planter who works there. When the chief met the church planter, he invited him to teach him the Bible. Now there is a group of 10 to 15 people in that area who

are worshipping every Sabbath, and the chief has become the Sabbath teacher. Shihaknuk Ville is located in southwest Cambodia.

There is another church planter working in the Chhloung district of Kratie province. He always turns on our program right on schedule. At first his father-in-law wasn't interested about what our worker said to him, but after he heard the radio program, it seems that God worked on his heart. He became interested in the good news of Jesus and accepted Jesus as his Savior. Kratie province is about 250 miles (400 kilometers) from Phnom Penh, in northeast Cambodia.

I have received many requests from church planters and some members who would like AWR to have Khmer programs every day. We want to get some media equipment, to develop programs here and send them to the radio stations.—Courtesy of Adventist World Radio.

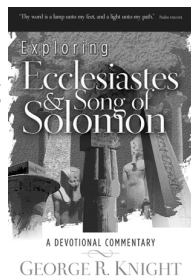

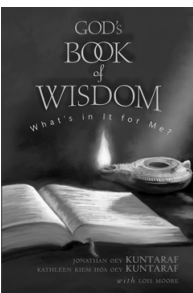
Title: **Exploring Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon**

Fun Run Needs You

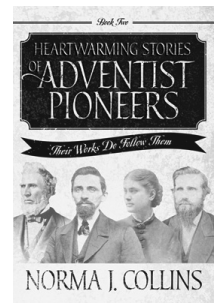

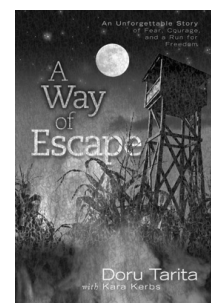
