On Monday, April 16, 2007, the deadliest mass shooting in U.S. history took place at Virginia Tech, a university of 26,000 students near Roanoke, Virginia, leaving dozens dead and many more injured. ## Follow Me (Luke 9:23-25)

"[Jesus] said to them: 'If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me. For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and is destroyed or lost himself?'" (Luke 9:23-25, NKJV).

What is this scripture really saying to us all? Could this be a radical statement for the world we live in today? Today's world eats, drinks, sleeps and breathes the air of SELF. SELF-indulgence, SELF-absorption, SELF-actualization, SELF-reliance, SELF-this, and SELF-that. The world today seems to be all about SELF! and I will, by His grace and with His help, follow Him no matter what the cost.

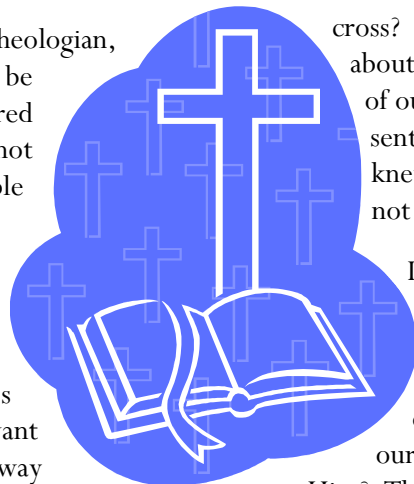
For true followers of Jesus the cross is not a piece of jewelry or a symbol; it's a lifestyle. To follow Jesus, we must be willing to give up self and our selfishness. We must be loyal to God no matter what the cost, and we must follow His ways and obey His commandments.

Thus, my cross to bear daily (and maybe yours, too) as talked about in Luke 9:23-25 has been identified and explained as a total buy-in to the life, character, and ways of Jesus.

How often do we pick up our cross? How heavy is our cross? You say, "It's pretty heavy!" Well, just think about how Jesus carried His cross to Calvary with all of our sins and all the sins of the world, past, present, and future, nailed to it. ## Jury Duty Scam

This has been verified on Snopes.com (link listed below) and on the FBI site (their link is also included below). This scam is spreading quickly, so be prepared should you get this call. Most of us take a summons for jury duty seriously, but enough people skip out on their civic duty that a new and ominous kind of scam has surfaced. Fall for it, and your identity could be stolen.

In this con, someone calls pretending to be a court official who threateningly says a warrant has been issued for your arrest because you didn't show up for jury duty. The caller claims to be a jury coordinator. If you protest that you never received a summons for jury duty, the scammer asks you for your Social Security number and date of birth so that he or she can verify the information and cancel the arrest warrant. Give out any of this information, and bingo—your identity just got stolen.

The scam has been reported so far in 11 states, including Oklahoma, Illinois, and Colorado. This scam is particularly insidious because the scammers use intimidation over the phone to try to bully people into giving information by pretending they're with the court system. The FBI and the federal court system have issued nationwide alerts on their Web sites, warning consumers about the fraud.
