## Caving Enthusiast

Some of you know that Jerry Bowen, Imaging, enjoys caving, but do you know to what extent? His adventurous spirit takes him down long ropes and deep into caves where walking in waist-deep water is common. Jerry has caved with scientists from Russia, Romania, and the United States. Government collecting permits are required for collecting troglodytes\* when Jerry leads scientists to the caves on collecting trips. Jerry has worked with the National Park Service on three projects on the C&O Canal, at Harpers Ferry, and Mammoth Cave. He has caved with Department of Natural Resources biologists doing field work in West Virginia and Maryland.

Early this year a Baltimore radio station interviewed him for one hour over the phone, and aired the program in June. Jerry was the lead man in arranging to have a local cave gated, working with the landowner and welder through delicate negotiations in 2004. He has taken numerous youth groups into local caves, including one from the Maryland School for the Deaf in Frederick, Maryland. Jerry helped to map a cave in Maryland that the owner wants kept secret, and with other mapping projects in West Virginia and Kentucky. He worked on a State of Maryland license plate project with an organizational emblem and has an impressive library of books and maps.

Whew! Well, just a few months ago, Fox Channel 5 was looking for a host grotto to take Holly Morris, one of their program producers, into a cave. Tri-State Grotto stepped up to the plate, and on November 5, 2007, Bob
