## Fun Run Promotes Health in Hagerstown

Pastor Brenda Billingsy of the Bladensburg SDA Church was triumphant as she crossed the finish line of the Vibrant Life 5K Fun Run and Walk held on October 5 here at the Review.

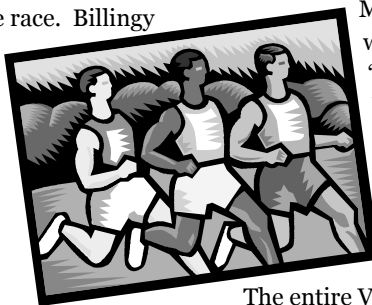
“They didn’t believe I could do it,” she said, referring to the doubts her church members had about her athletic ability. Listening to a mix of Daryl Coley on her iPod for inspiration, she turned in a respectable time among the 169 participants in the race. Billingsy says she ran the race for a girlfriend who was dying of cancer. Part of the proceeds of the Fun Run are dedicated to support breast cancer awareness.

The first-place winner, Dennis Coleman, ran in memory of his sister who passed away eight years ago after a struggle with cancer. “I try to take care of this body that God gave me,” says Coleman, who must be doing a good job because the 50-year-old Gaithersburg man never gave any of the younger runners a chance to pass. The fastest runner among the women, Karen Abbamonte was also 50 years old. Abbamonte didn’t take up the sport until she was in her mid-40s, then began running partly just to “get out of the house.”

Once again, the winner in the 1- to 10-year-old female category was 10-year-old Courtney Tooley, daughter of **Richard Tooley**, Periodical Division, and his wife, Melynie.

“I liked running out in nature,” says seven-year-old Kari Remmers, whose father is pastor of the Hagerstown Church.

Hazel Vetter, age 94, mother of **Joy Thomas**, HHES, who likes to attend the Willow Brook Church, was the oldest person at the starting line. Hazel’s walking companion, 89-year-old Leona Thomas, mother of **Dale Thomas**, HHES, also walked about a mile.



Many participants didn’t come to work themselves into a lather. “I’m just walking,” insisted Violet Kamori, a member of the Baltimore First church in Elliott City. “Just trying to be healthy,” agreed her friend Robin Wells.

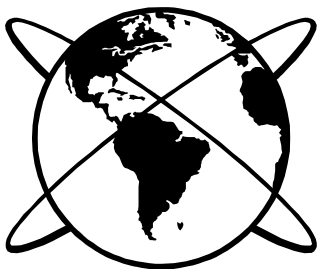
