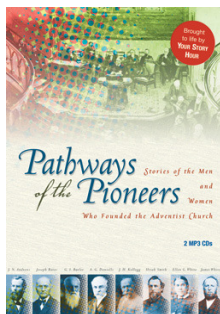

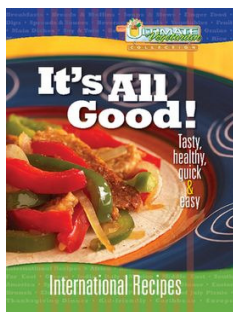

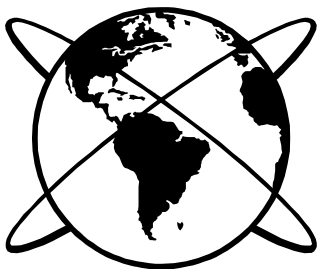

Historic Fairchild Plane Returns Home

The Hagerstown Aviation Museum will be flying its 1953 Fairchild C-119 "Flying Boxcar" from Greybull, Wyoming, to Hagerstown, Maryland, with a projected arrival date of November 2. The C-119 has just undergone a two-month inspection, maintenance, and repair for its ferry flight from Greybull, Wyoming, to Hagerstown, Maryland.

Built in Hagerstown in 1953, the museum's airplane was one of a handful that was built for the Royal Canadian Air Force, and stayed in service until the 1980s. The airplane has a wingspan of 109 feet and a tail height of 26 feet. It has two Wright 3350 engines. The museum's "Flying Boxcar" was purchased from the Canadian Air Force by Hawkins and Powers of Greybull, Wyoming, and modified to become a fire bomber. Outfitted with tanks to haul fire retardant, the airplane would fly over forest fires dropping its load of retardant to help extinguish fires or restrict them from advancing. This same C-119 was purchased by Bob Stanford of Fredericksburg, Virginia, in August of 2006 and donated to the Hagerstown Aviation Museum in December that year.

Frank Lamm (pilot), T. R. Proven (copilot), and Jack Fastnaught (flight engineer) will be the crew for the C-119's historic flight home. The scheduled flight consists of leaving Greybull, Wyoming, on Wednesday or Thursday morning and traveling to Ottumwa, Iowa, the home of the Antique Airplane Association. The crew and airplane will then rest that evening in preparation for the next day, taking off from Ottumwa and traveling to Warrenton, Virginia, where they will land in the afternoon of either Thursday or Friday. Preliminary plans call for the airplane to take off from Warrenton around 1:00 p.m. on Sunday afternoon and arrive in Hagerstown between 1:30 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. The airplane will be escorted by several vintage airplanes and others. Everyone is invited to this free event to witness the last flight of a C-119 over Hagerstown. The homecoming event will be held at Hagerstown Aircraft Services, where the airplane can be toured by donation after its landing and where other museum aircraft will be on display.

The museum wants to thank the more than 400 donors who have contributed thus far to the Bring Home the C-119 campaign. More than \$55,000 has been raised during the past two months. Because our goal of \$80,000 has not yet been reached, the fund-raising campaign for the C-119 will continue until the additional \$25,000 is raised and the debt incurred by the museum is paid in full.

Daylight Saving Time Ends on November 2, 2008

Daylight saving time officially ends at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, November 2, 2008, so turn your clocks back on Saturday night for an extra hour of sleep on Sunday morning.

Isn't it interesting? In the U.S., a man born just after 12:00 a.m. the daylight saving time circumvented the Vietnam War draft by using a DST loophole.



When drafted, he argued that, in the year of his birth, standard time rather than DST was the official time for recording births in his state of Delaware. Thus, under official standard time, he was actually born on the previous day—and that day had a much higher draft lottery number, allowing him to avoid the draft.
