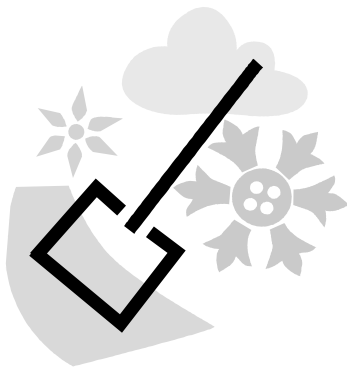

## CLAIM Field Game

The Review leads the way in witnessing field games. The Review and Herald teams have more than five weeks of training in the CLAIM game that trains local church members to connect the principles of the daily Sabbath school lesson with the daily news to witness—daily.

Some of our Review and Herald employees who work the early-morning shift remain after work for about two hours to play the game, or go home and return.

My hat is off to our athletes at the February 10 training who maintained their “cool” despite flubs with the balloons. A balloon refusing to break is not uncommon—just another simulation of unexpected trials in witnessing—and brings in a lot of laughter. Athletes find it useful to shake their balloon when they first pick it up, to make sure there is a paper inside. Sometimes the paper is blank—another little surprise. In both classes, the facilitator chooses the question.

Team A has “whipped” Team B two weeks in a row, both times by 4 points; however, both teams had significantly higher scores the second week.

Scholars are getting the feel of it:

- Marta Delgado is a master at building into her responses informational links with which she can follow up with a witnessing contact or that the Holy Spirit will build on in a “divine appointment” for another witness.
- David Haluska masterfully builds credibility into his responses and provides details for analytical thinkers.
- David Anderson is a superb conversationalist who makes the listener comfortable with his observations.
- Carolyn Martin has a real knack for making concrete connections to the lesson.
- Alejandra Rodriguez is skilled in connecting daily events with lesson principles.

So scholars are learning from one another to improve and strengthen their responses. The athletes, scorekeeper, timekeeper, judges, and I also are learning from them. Some athletes are moving into scholar roles.

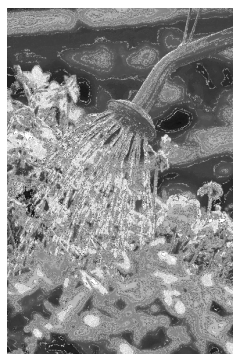

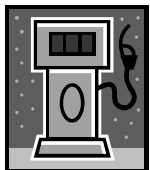

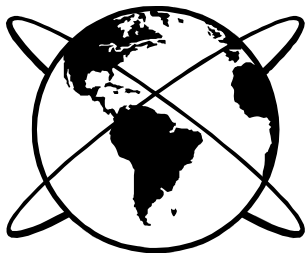
