CLAIM Field Game Exhibition Stimulates Outreach

On March 16, 2009, the Review and Herald teams of trainees for the LEAD magazine CLAIM Field Game successfully completed their first-ever exhibition game at Monday morning chapel. Players are all Review and Herald employees who voluntarily train one hour a week after completing a 9.5-hour workday.

Adding to the fun-training-in-witnessing strategy, **Brigitte DeLong** had a well-organized cheer team: **William Vargas, Janet Ford, Ron Brauer, and Oscar Hernandez**. They launched the exhibition by leading the audience in the "North American Division Theme Song and Cheer" for Sabbath school.

An Upset

That morning the Scripture Battlers scored 62 points, making their first and only win against the Bible Centurions' 50. The exhibition game capped off an eight-week training session. The victorious members were **Alejandra Rodriguez, Marta Delgado, Sherry Strickland, David Haluska, Tony Delgado, and Randy Huntzberry**. The able contenders included **Carolyn Martin, Karen Gohlke, Vondel Anderson, Janet Ford, Steve Hamous, and David Anderson**.

Candy DeVore, Ed Crumbly, and Samuel Thomas, Jr., were the judges in training. **Marjorie Chambers** kept score, and **Stan Hannum and David Robinson** were time-keepers. **Faith Crumbly**, editor of LEAD, facilitated the training and the exhibition game. A registered Bible instructor who came to observe spoke very positively about the value of the game as a witnessing simulation and also as a fellowship opportunity. "On a Saturday night in a fellowship hall, you could even have popcorn," she said.

Ongoing Training

A new training series began on Monday, March 23. This session began with a salute to the exhibition teams with a cake baked by Review employee **Kaye Emerick**. This series focuses on the principles of the Sabbath school lesson for the previous week, rather than using one lesson for the entire training. So the first session used "The Blessings of the Prophetic Gift," the lesson addressed in local churches on March 21. Faith Crumbly explained: "We want trainees to actually be engaged in using the lesson-and-news witnessing connection each day, rather than focusing on one lesson for a future event. Daily witnessing is what keeps church members sharp."

Some participants continue to train but in different positions: Sherry Strickland and Tony Delgado, former athletes, are now training as scholars. Marta Delgado, formerly a scholar captain, joined the athletes. Marjorie Chambers (scribe) has switched roles with Ed Crumbly (judge). Players switch roles to get hands-on experience in the various positions and to work toward CLAIM Field Game certification.

Irma Brooks, the new timekeeper, is using a large stopclock that enables trainees to visually track their own time in addition to hearing the bell tones. Previously, visual timing was available only through the R&H media system in the chapel. This new training series is held in the Executive Dining Room on Tuesdays, beginning at 5:35 p.m. Everyone is welcome to observe any training session.

The next game, the first full game for the R&H teams, is scheduled for Saturday night, April 18. The location will be announced.
