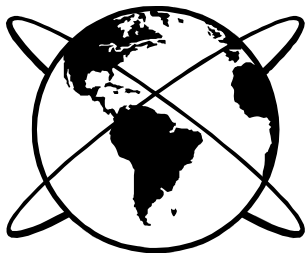

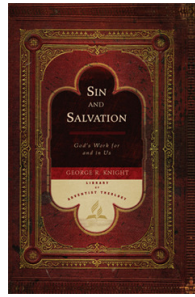

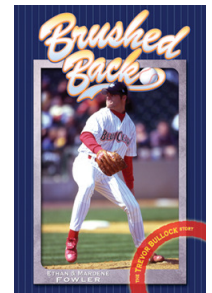
Converted from agnosticism to Christianity more than 40 years ago, George R. Knight long wrestled with what it means to be saved—what God can do for us and in us.

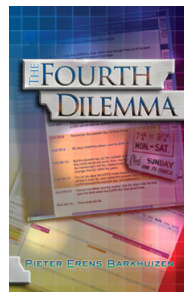
