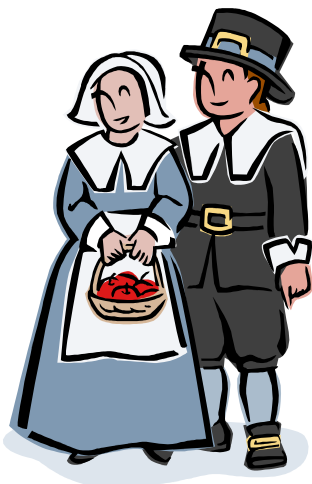

Adventist World Radio Report

November 20, 2009

We are seeing miracles in the lives of people from all walks of life and from all regions of the world. In October 2008 AWR began broadcasting our Thai programs via short-wave and on four FM radio stations in various parts of Thailand. Millions of people are being reached, and stories of how this radio ministry is shaping the lives of listeners are already coming in. Insom, a speaker for AWR's *True Way of Life* radio program, recently gave us a report, which I have excerpted for you below. The full story is in AWR's *2009 Annual Report*:

“It has been said that Buddhist countries become the grave for Christian missionaries. Thailand is a country where the Adventist message has been preached for a century, yet there are only 12,000 people who have accepted the gospel. The church has tried its best methods to convey the message to Thais, with very few results. The population has greatly increased in the last few decades, and the challenge for the church is how we can communicate Christ to vast groups of people. Radio ministry has come to the attention of some church leaders and members.

“Kobsook, the wife of a retired colonel, was distressed by problems in her personal life. Her belongings had been stolen by her niece, and her son had had an accident. Feeling depressed, she turned to the *True Way of Life* program, and the light of Christ shone into her heart. Kobsook called in and asked

how to meet the pastor and attend church. She has kept coming to church for more than a month and has attended the evangelistic meetings with her husband.

“Please pray for Thai Buddhists, who hesitate to attend Christian evangelistic meetings but listen to our radio program in their own home. This is the key to our new approach to millions in Thailand.”

Thanks to you, the following are highlights of some of AWR's recent initiatives:

- ◆ Launch of the first Adventist Media Center in the Israel Field of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, where radio programs in Hebrew and Russian are being produced by an all-volunteer team in Tel Aviv.
- ◆ Opening of an AWR studio at Mission College in Thailand, where programs are produced in Thai, Lao, and Hmong for listeners in Southeast Asia.
- ◆ AWR helped establish the first Adventist-owned radio station in Papua New Guinea by providing significant funding to Pacific Adventist University (PAU).
- ◆ A group of volunteers is running a new FM station at the University of Eastern Africa, in Baraton, Kenya. The program is known as *The Fountain of Joy* and can be heard by more than a million people.

Lori Williams is looking for contest ideas that will keep us in an exercising mode. If you have any ideas, please share them with her.

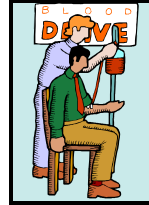

Mission Trip Request

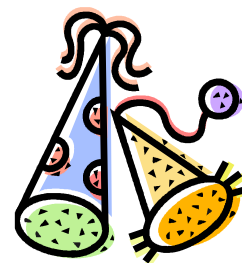

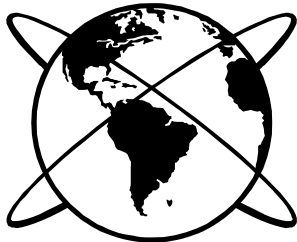

- ◆ A studio has just been established at the mission office in Dakar, Senegal, where programs in Wolof and Mandinka will be produced. These are new languages for AWR.
- ◆ AWR helps the Burundi Association start an FM station in Bujumbura, which broadcasts programs in the official Kirundi language. Radio Agakiza—which translates as “Salvation Radio”—has quickly become known, and is very highly regarded by the people.

We have a lot to be thankful for this year as God has blessed the ministry and He has blessed us with prayer partners like you, who faithfully lift us up and provide your financial resources to finish this work. Thank you for your faithfulness!

But we are not resting until the job is done! This year AWR has taken an enormous financial leap of faith forward with the upcoming launch of a media asset management (MAM) system that will enable us to begin offering all of our radio programs in 80 languages in podcast format—digital recording accessible through the Internet—and thus reach the “new continent” called the digital world. “The podcasts will particularly appeal to the emigrants who have established themselves in new countries around the global,” says global resource engineer Daryl Gungadoo.

And these podcasts will be especially helpful in the North American Division, where for the first time, Adventists pastors and laypeople will be able to use the podcasts as a valuable tool as they seek to evangelize ethnic communities.

We are at war with unseen spiritual foes, so I would ask that you please keep AWR in your prayers and thank you again for your continued support. As we partner together we will help speed the Lord's return.
