Open Wide!

Is there a link between mouth health and overall well-being?

A recent study presented at the Eighty-seventh International Association for Dental Research General Session and Exhibition found that heart attack victims had higher numbers of bacteria in their mouths.

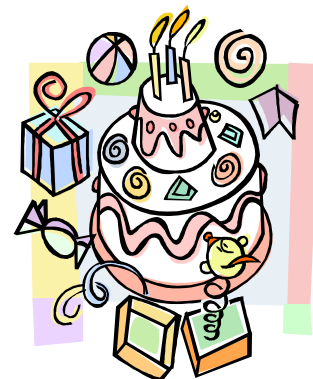

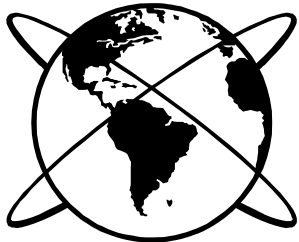

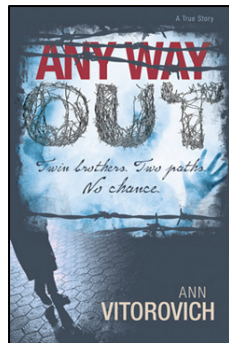
